The Veterans Family Fund of America has a program designed to raise money to help our veterans and their families with their financial burdens as they return from Iraq

and Afghanastan. It helps the family that stays behind while the service member is not home. It works like this: purchase a CD for a minimum of \$100.00 in a Veterans Family Fund CD for six months, sign an agreement authorizing your bank or credit union to forward one half of the interest earned at maturity to the (VFFA) as a donation. At the end of six months you will receive half the interest and a receipt for your tax donation. The money will be used by the Washington State Department of Veterans Affairs. Nearly 100 percent of the money will be used for veterans and their families. Additional information can be found at http://veteransfamilyfund.org. A list of participating banks and credit unions can be found there. Check out the program and do the math before investing. This program was also written up in the Columbian by Tom Koeminger on November 15, 2007.

Our member renewals are at 455 for 72.5% of our goal for 2008. This leaves us with 173 renewals needed to hit the 100 percent mark. If you have not paid your dues by the end of December, you will lose your FREE \$1000.00 Accidental Insurance Policy. That may not sound like much, but you should have been in my shoes when I had to explain to a member's widow whose husband died accidently that he had not renewed his dues and his policy was no longer valid.

We missed a lot of you at the Veterans Day Parade. It seems to me that Americanism is losing the battle. I found that many people who should be teaching youngsters about the flag and patriotisim, do not know anything themselves. I pointed out to several scout groups that they need to keep the flag pole vertical so the American Flag does not drag on the ground. The looks I got from some of the Scout leaders for butting in made me feel very uncomfortable. We as veterans need to participate in local programs so the Scouts will know what to do, be able to do it properly and grow up

uderstanding the meaning of patriotism. The American Legion has literature available and knowledgeable members to share their expertise.

Remember to send in your Dues. We need your support!


