On Sunday, May 17th, our Post will be hosting all of the area Boys/Girls State attendees and their families for the annual 5th District Boys/Girls State orientation. This is both a welcome to the program they are entering as well as an introduction to the schedule and activities that these 11th grade students will participate in at the Boys/Girls State program. The event starts with a sign-in, then lunch at noon and the orientation follows lunch.

FINANCE OFFICER

The 2009 membership year is just about history. We appear to be at the end of renewals with 477 members renewed of our 609 member goal. I suppose the economy had something to do with some of those who have not renewed. We also had 26 members who passed away during the year. The new membership year for 2010 will be starting in July after the Department of Washington's Convention. Consider signing up for a Life Membership(PUFL) before the 2010 membership year begins. You can deduct this years dues from the overall cost. In other words, if you were to fall in the age group with the total of \$400, deduct the dues cost of \$40, so you would pay \$360 for a lifetime membership. In so doing, you do not receive any more notices to pay your dues. And, if there is another rate increase, it will not affect you.
