Well, it's that time of the year again. Time to decide who will take the service of our Post upon themselves. For those who have missed a few meetings, we have held nominations and the official vote for Officers. I now announce Post Officers for the 2011/2012 year. Some important things have been happening at the Post that I want to make everyone aware of. First off, we are actively entertaining proposals to sell our Post. There is a lot of history in the property we currently own and it would be wonderful if we could simply make repairs and continue on. However, the Post is sitting on top of a small lake and our furnace is drowning. There are other issues that border on safety as well. The Board would be remiss if we didn't look into some of the offers coming our way. What we want is a "turn key" situation. We pick out a piece of land, a building is built with our specifications and we swap keys, the new place for the old, deed for deed. Currently we are considering pieces of land being offered, no decisions have been made. We will keep the membership up on all developments, so stay tuned for updates.

Next is the decision to sell the lease to the tower on our property, just the lease and not the property it sits on. The deal includes a large up front payment and then 50% of all rentals each month. We will also be purchasing a new security system with many capabilities, and can be moved to the new Post when we go. Lastly, I'd like to mention that the construction around our Post continues.
